Tribute to a True American Hero

This past summer, on June 23, an exemplary Vianney graduate was killed while serving his country in Iraq. Lt. Daniel P. Riordan's sacrifice and service touched the St. Louis area as a whole but truly shocked the wider Vianney community. Riordan, Class of 2001, died from injuries sustained in a roadside bomb attack during a combat mission northwest of Baghdad. He was serving with the 1st Cavalry Division stationed out of Fort Hood, Texas.

Amazingly, Vianney Learning Consultant Pattie Czajkowski received an e-mail from Riordan just days before he died. Riordan wrote, "I will father, Rick Riordan, his stepmother, always remember my years at Vianney as four of my best. I hope you can keep the spirit of Vianney alive so that other guys get to have the same experience that I did! Please pass along a big howdy to the Vianney family for me. Thank you for your support and prayers. I'll be in touch."

To honor this great student, soldier and American patriot, the Lt. Daniel P. Riordan Scholarship Fund has been established at Vianney. The scholarship will be given to a student who shows financial need and exhibits the qualities of faith, honor and service.

"Lt. Dan was a man who loved his family, his God and his country," said his sister, Suzanne Riordan. He is survived also by his mother, Jeanine Rainey, his stepfather, Bob Rainey, his

Michelle Riordan, and a twin brother, Nick.
